

## APPENDIX 2

### NATIONAL CURRICULUM OF ADULT EDUCATION

#### **First Level: Basic**

After completion the 144 hours of education is expected to achieve the following skills in three areas.

Reading: A learner will be

- able to read and understand the structures from of the words of 4 letters with signs
- able to read sentence of 8 words, there will be no joint letter.
- able to identify and read numbers upto 1000.

Writing:

- able to write words following dictation
- able to write a least five sentences on his/her own.
- able to write his/her name and address.
- able to write numbers upto the following dictation.

Numeracy:

- able to compute additions of 2 digits and 3 line results of which will be within 100.
- able to compute subtraction of 2 digits.
- able to conceptualize with unit, tens, hundred and thousands.
- able to acquainted with the problem of multiplication and divisions.

**Second Level: Middle**

After completion of 96 hours of education, a learner is expected to achieve the following skills in 3 areas.

**Reading:**

- able to be familiar with and read with simple and popularly joint letters.
- able to read and understand the easy and development oriented stories, reports, journals, and
- able to communicate with others.
- able to read poster, signboards and road directions etc.
- able to read table of multiplication of 1 to 10.

**Writing:**

- able to write a paragraph independently on any subject.
- able to write letters.

**Numeracy:**

- able to compute addition of 4 digits and 3 lines.
- able to do sum of subtraction of 4 digits.
- able to be familiar with the concept of Taka and Paisa.
- able to conceptualize with length, weight and measures/scales.

**Third level: Self Learning**

After completion of 48 hours of education, a learners is expected to achieve the following skills in 3 areas.

**Reading:**

- able to read tabloids of 14 points type.
- able to analyse the themes of the text read by.

Writing:

- able to write at least one page on any specific subject.
- able to draft applications.
- able to fill in simple forms and receipts.
- able to answer simple question writing.

Numeracy:

- able to compute addition subtraction easily.
- able to compute simple multiplication and division of 2 and 3 digits respectively.
- able to understand the concept of fractions.
- able to make family budget.
- able to prepare budget for income generation project.
